TODAY'S READING: Romans 8:18-27

I consider our present sufferings not worth comparing to the glory to be revealed in us. For creation waits in eager expectation for God's children to be revealed. Creation was subject to frustration, not by its choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation will be liberated from bondage to decay and brought to the freedom and glory of God's children.

We know the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently.

In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know how we ought to pray, but the Spirit intercedes for us in groans that cannot be uttered. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, for the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.

GOSPEL TEXT: Matthew 13:24-30,36-43

Jesus told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field. But while everyone was sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away. When the wheat sprouted and formed heads, then the weeds also appeared.

"The owner's servants came to him and said, 'Sir, didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where then did the weeds come from?'

"An enemy did this,' he replied.

"The servants asked him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?'

"'No,' he answered, 'because while you are pulling the weeds, you may uproot the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest. At that time I will tell the harvesters: First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned; then gather the wheat and bring it into my barn."

Then he left the crowd and went into the house. His disciples came to him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field."

He answered, "The one who sowed the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world, and the good seed stands for the people of the kingdom. The weeds are the people of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels.

"As the weeds are pulled up and burned in the fire, so it will be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send out his angels, and they will weed out of his kingdom everything that causes sin and all who do evil. They will throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears, let them hear.

P: The Gospel of the Lord

C: Praise to you, O Christ.

THE MESSAGE: "Growing Like Weeds"

Romans 14:1—15:7

- P: Accept one with a weak faith without any disputes.
- C: One person's faith allows them to eat anything,
- P: but another, whose faith is weak, eats only vegetables.
- C: Neither must treat the other with any contempt.
- P: For God has accepted them. Who are you to judge?
- C: Servants will stand or fall before their own master.
- P: And they will stand for the Lord is able to make them.
- C: One person considers one day more sacred.
- P: Another considers every day to be alike.
- C: Both should be fully convinced in their own mind.
- P: Whoever considers a day special does so to the Lord.
- C: Whoever eats meat gives thanks to the Lord God.
- P: Whoever abstains does so to the Lord and thanks God.
- C: For none of us lives for ourselves alone.
- P: And none of us dies for ourselves alone."
- C: For if we live, we live for the Lord.
- P: And if we die, we die for the Lord.
- C: So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord.
- P: For this very reason, Christ died and returned to life,
- C: so he may be the Lord of both the living and dead.
- P: You, then, why do you judge your brother or sister?
- C: Why treat them with contempt?
- L: For we all will stand before God's judgment seat.
- C: As it is written: As surely as I live, says the Lord, every knee will bow before me; and every tongue will confess to God.

- P: So each one will give an account of our self to God.
- C: Then let us stop passing judgment on each other.
- P: Instead, make up your mind not to put any stumbling block or obstacle in the way of a brother or sister.
- C: For I am convinced, fully persuaded in the Lord Jesus, that nothing is unclean in and of itself.
- P: If anyone regards something as unclean, it is for them.
- C: And if your brother or sister is distressed by what you eat, you are no longer acting in love.
- P: Do not destroy someone Christ died for by your food.
- C: And do not let what is good be spoken of as evil.
- P: For the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking,
- C: but righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.
- P: Anyone who serves Christ in this way pleases God.
- C: Let's make every effort to do what leads to peace.
- P: All food is clean, but it is wrong for a person to eat anything that causes someone else to stumble.
- C: Better not to eat meat, drink wine or do anything else that will cause your brother or sister to fall.
- P: Whatever you believe, keep between you and God.
- C: Whoever has doubts is condemned if they eat.
- P: For anything that does not come from faith is sin.
- C: Each of us should please our neighbors for good.
- P: Build them up, for Christ did not please himself.
- C: And we who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves...
- P: May God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same mind Jesus had toward each other,
- C: so with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- P: Accept one another, then just as Christ accepted you,
- C: in order to bring praise to God.
